First, I thank God for saving me and filling me with his precious Holy Ghost. I will forever worship and praise God for every blessing and for the opportunity to share some of my testimony and one of my favorite scriptures.

God is a prayer hearing and a prayer answering God. At age 15, I was in and out of the hospital with chronic asthma attacks and one almost took my life but God said not so. While at a revival, I stood in the prayer line and God healed my lungs. I learned early to call on the name of the Lord.

In 2008, the doctor diagnosed cancer but God blocked it. Bishop Macklin preached a message that encouraged my journey, his message was entitled “Speak to Your Problem”. I meditated on healing scriptures, my surgery was successful, and I received my miracle. After 17 years, I’m still cancer free. My affirmation, “I BELIEVE GOD HALLELUJAH I’M HEALED!” is still posted on my wall.

In 2020, covid struck my husband and I at the same time. Being too sick to take care of each other, God heard me before I called and I heard the Holy Spirit say, “I will take care of you”. God raised me up, healed me, and let me live.

Being raised in a Godly home with eight other siblings, my parents struggled to survive. We didn’t have much, but we had God and God had us. God provided food.

Just one bad sunburn increases your risk of skin cancer.

People with darker skin tones can still get sunburned and are often diagnosed with skin cancer at later stages, making awareness essential for all.

Summer Safety Tips

- **Wear sunscreen** – Choose SPF 30 or higher and reapply every 2 hours.
- **Cover up** – Wide-brim hats, sunglasses, and lightweight long sleeves offer added protection.
- **Time it right** – Avoid peak sun (10 a.m. – 4 p.m.) or seek shade.
- **Hydrate** – Drink plenty of water, especially during outdoor activities.
- **Be watchful** – Keep an eye on children and older adults, who are more vulnerable to heat.
- **Fireworks safety** – Leave fireworks to professionals to avoid burns and injuries.

How long have you been a member of our church and involved in the Women's Ministry? I've been a member since February 2013. I was a member of the Center of Hope Community church for 45 years.

What keeps you encouraged and grounded in your faith? Because time and time again, God has always come through even in those darkest times especially during a death of a loved one, I always say, I may not understand the mind of God but I do understand his heart.

Is there a scripture that has carried you through different seasons of your life? There are so many for so many different occasions and circumstances at that moment. That's what I love about the word of God. You can always find a scripture for whatever situation you may be facing.

How have you balanced serving your family while also serving in ministry? Family first

What has motherhood taught you about God? How long suffering and patient He has been to me.

You retired from the State of California—what are you most proud of from that season of your life? That it's over LOL.

What wisdom would you share with women preparing for retirement? Just do it. Don't wait because life is too short. I knew a lady who worked two full time jobs all of her life. When she finally decided to retire, she was turning in her uniform and had a stroke leaving the office. She died 5 days later. I said that was not going to be my testimony. As soon as I turned 62, I turned in my paperwork.

Looking back, how did your journey begin as the creator of the Women's Ministry newsletter, and what has God shown you through serving in that role? I blame Lady Macklin for this LOL.

What do you hope women receive each month when they read it? I hope they are encouraged, inspired, and motivated to continue the fight. This month marks 8 years of the Cover Girls Newsletter.

You serve faithfully, often behind the scenes. What motivates you to continue? Again, I blame Lady Macklin for this LOL.

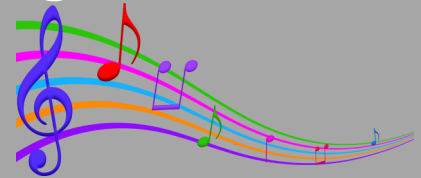
