My God is a sustainer, even during a PANDEMIC!

When the world shutdown on March 17, 2020 my job

arranged for me to work from home despite the fact

that previous requests to do so had been denied.

We were in the process of putting our home on the market and everything came to a screeching halt. After several months of uncertainty and worldwide restrictions, I just didn't think we were going to be able to sell our home. But God! Our home not only sold but for over and above the asking price. Our new home is almost twice the size and half the cost!

In December of 2020, I officially retired from my job. When I prepared my taxes for 2021,

my income was only 1/3 of what I made while working. All praises belong to God because there has not been one time that I have been without shelter, food, clothing, or multiple vehicles. My monthly bills are few and have never been late.

My grandson, Isaiah who is now 7 years old, was diagnosed with Autism and a sensory sensitivity disorder prior to the pandemic nonetheless, he has flourished. His teachers, therapists, and doctors are amazed and challenged to set goals for him because he is so far ahead of his age group. He was non-verbal until age 5.

Now, he is talking from the time he wakes until he goes to sleep.

Healthy Living Sickle Cell Disease

Sickle cell disease (SCD) is a group of inherited disorders affecting red blood cells. Normal red blood cells are round and carry oxygen to all parts of the body. In SCD, the red blood cells look like a C-shaped farm tool called a "sickle". They can become hard and sticky, which allows them to get stuck and occlude a small blood vessel. When this happens, severe pain, organ damage, serious infections, acute chest pain, and strokes can occur.

Another type of sickle cell disorder is called Sickle Cell Trait (SCT). SCT is not as serious as SCD, because people with SCT usually do not have any of the signs of the disease and live a normal life. People with SCD inherit two abnormal genes (one from the mother and one from the father). People with SCT inherit only one abnormal gene from either the father or mother. In these individuals, the presence of one normal gene is sufficient for them to lead a relatively normal life.

It is estimated that SCD affects 90,000 to 100,000 people in the United States (mainly Blacks or African Americans). It can be seen in 1 of every 365 Black or African Americans; and 1 out of every 16,300 Hispanic American births. About 1 in 13 Black or African American babies is born with SCT.

The necessary treatment for SCD and/or sickle cell crisis (patients with excruciating pain) include blood transfusion, maintaining high fluid intake (8-10 glasses of water daily), intravenous fluid therapy (fluid through the veins), and certain medications.

People with SCD can live full lives and should stay as healthy as possible. Tips for staying healthy include: 1) finding good medical care, 2) get regular checkups, 3) take steps to prevent infections, 4) learn healthy habits, 5) get involved in clinical studies, and 6) participate in support groups or community-based organizations that provide support and information about SCD.

Sarah was a strong woman in the Bible. She was the wife of Abraham. She served as an example of the fact that God always keeps his promises. God promised Abraham he would bare a son, despite Sarah's inability to bear children. She ultimately gave birth to Isaac when she was 90 years old.

"And God said, Sarah thy wife shall bear thee a son indeed; and thou shalt call his name Isaac: and I will establish my covenant with him for an everlasting covenant, and with his seed after him" (*Gen.* 17:19).

Sarah was a simple, beautiful, and very human woman; she made mistakes, just like we all do. She stepped ahead of God and tried to handle His business on her own by foolishly sending her handmaid, Hagar, to Abraham to bring forth the child God had promised. In so doing, she ignited a feud that has lasted for 4,000 years.
