Inspirational Testimony



Mother Mamie Simon & Evette

First, I want to give thanks, praise, and honor to God for allowing my mother, Mother Mamie Simon to be here for another Mother's Day, 2025 at the age of 95 years old. Second, I want to thank Bishop and Lady Macklin, and the GTI family for keeping my mom in your prayers.

My mom health challenges began in 2016, when she was diagnosed with Parathyroid Disease. This made her weak and tired, and at times, she could barely walk. That's when I started going once a week to help her and my stepdad. Papa Gus, who also started having some health challenges. He passed away in 2019, then my brother passed away 6 months later in 2020, my mom's only son. I could see their deaths took more of a toll on her health.

Then in 2022, my mom was diagnosed with congestive heart failure, stage 4 kidney failure, and a prolapse colon. From 2022 to 2024, my mom was in and out of the hospital because her feet would swell so big from heart failure. They would have to remove fluid from around her heart and from her lungs, which would take 3-4 days, sometimes 5 days in the hospital.

In February 2024, I had to take my mom back to the hospital because of the swelling in her feet and I could hear the fluid in her chest. This time it was different and worse.

Understanding Vertigo and Its Relationship to the Ear

What is Vertigo?

Vertigo is a specific type of dizziness characterized by the false sensation of spinning or movement. It is not merely a feeling of lightheadedness or a loss of consciousness.

Distinguishing Vertigo from Other Conditions

It is crucial to differentiate vertigo from other types of dizziness, such as lightheadedness, presyncope, or disequilibrium.

Vertigo and the Ear

The ear plays a crucial role in balance and spatial orientation, making it a key organ in understanding vertigo. The vestibular system is responsible for detecting motion.

Five Key Diagnoses for Causes of Vertigo

1. Benign Paroxysmal Positional Vertigo (BPPV) (95%)

BPPV is one of the most common causes of vertigo. It occurs when tiny calcium carbonate crystals (otoconia) within the inner ear dislodge and move into the (the loops of the cochlea).

2. Ménière's Disease

Ménière's disease is a chronic condition of the inner ear that causes recurrent episodes of vertigo. It is often accompanied by fluctuating hearing loss, tinnitus, and a sensation of fullness in the affected ear.

3. Vestibular Neuritis

Vestibular neuritis is an inflammation of the vestibular nerve, which transmits balance information from the inner ear to the brain. It is caused by a viral infection.

4. Labyrinthitis

Labyrinthitis like vestibular neuritis involves inflammation of the nerve and the cochlea. Patients experience both vertigo and hearing loss, along with tinnitus.

5. Superior Canal Dehiscence

Superior canal dehiscence syndrome is a rare disorder. Central (Brain or spinal cord) Causes of Vertigo. Central vertigo arises from issues within the central nervous system, particularly the brainstem or cerebellum.

Conclusion

Vertigo is a complex condition that can stem from the ear or other parts of the body. Understanding the specific type and origin of vertigo is essential for effective diagnosis and treatment.

She joined GTI because she enrolled in school and the commute going back and forth to church from the Bay to Palo Alto and attending school became too difficult. New Sweet Home was her family church where she attended as a child. She was 9 years old when her family joined. Her mom, sister, uncle, and other family members still attend church there.

Sister Renita is thankful for the Church of God in Christ. She grew up in church but left the church. When she was out in the world, she became pregnant. She decided she wasn't going to keep the baby. When she went to the doctor to abort the baby, the doctor informed her she might be pregnant with twins and ordered an ultrasound. As the doctor was listening to the heart beat, it was the strongest heart beat he had ever heard. The Lord said to her, "this baby is crying out, saying let me live. If you keep this baby, you shall be bless." That moment, I asked the Lord to save me because I can't do this by myself. That was in 1999, she gave her life back to the Lord. It hasn't always been easy but God has always made a way.

The first ministry she joined was Sunday School. She remember, she didn't want to do it but Sister Robinson told her I need to talk to you. She said, "I told myself, I'm just going to sit in the back and not get involved. I didn't want to do anything. But that is not what God had for me. I listened to the voice of God." Then she became leader of the Single's Ministry. One Sunday, Bishop came up to me and told me he wanted me to the director of this ministry. She told him, "Bishop that's not me. I'm more of the behind the scenes person." At that time, Sister Charone was the director but she wanted to pass the baton due to her health challenges. Bishop said, "You will be fine."

Sister Renita would like to see the Single's Ministry come together as a ministry and reach out to those who are not saved letting them know Jesus loves them. She would like the Singles Ministry to have their own Bible study, singles conferences, and 12 hour prayer. She said, "Dad Macklin

used to always say, as a single person, you can devote more of your time to God because you don't have a spouse." She would like the Single Ministries to provide support and encouragement to single parents as well, letting them know, they are not alone.

Sister Renita is happy to be a part of GTI and she loves her leaders. She said, "We have leaders that are one of a kind. They are wonderful." Her message to Lady Macklin, "You are a mother of many nations. Don't ever change."

The doctors came to me and said, she only have about 6 months to live and placed her in hospice.

My mom was sent some with oxygen, a nebulizer, and morphine, which I was against, and only gave maybe twice for pain. Her feet continued to swell, she slept a lot, and the prolapse colon still fell down at times but God!!! So many times, I thought this was it, but the prayers of the saints and God began to work. Every time, Bishop passed out blessed oil, I would get a bottle for my mom and anoint her with it, and sometimes, she would anoint herself. The hospice doctor wanted me to stop giving the medicines for her heart and removing the fluid but I didn't feel it in my spirit. So, I didn't and told the doctor that I wasn't. The doctor said to me, "Well, she is dying anyway." But God, he has the last say. He told me to remove her from hospice and I did.

These last 4 months, my mom's feet has not swelled, I have not had to give her oxygen, nor use the nebulizer, and I have disposed the morphine. She's up walking around at times, and has been to church three times so far, which she hadn't been in 5 1/2 years.

Yes, they still say she still has all the medical conditions. Even this past March, her heart test showed she now has Ventricular Tachycardia. But one year and five months later my mom is still here. I continue to believe and trust God. Also, I know prayer works!!!

Worker for the Lord

"Salute the beloved Persis, who labored much in the Lord." (Rom. 16:12b).

Persis was a remarkable Woman of the Bible and this verse speaks volumes about the character and contribution to the early church. Her name is Greek origin meaning a Persian woman. Not much else is known about her except she stayed in Rome and serve the Lord with Paul and other believers. Her story focuses on dedication and hard work within the church community. Paul salutes several women, but gives three distinct commendations that set Persis apart from the others.

First, "The Beloved"

His statement suggest that Persis work demonstrated her love and she was greatly loved and dear to heart. Her work in the ministry earned the love and respect of those around her.

Secondly, "Who Labored Much"

Persis was intensely dedicated, and faithfully served in the church. She fed the hungry, housed the homeless, and prayed for the sick. She did whatever needed to be done. As a disciple, she ministered, studied God's Word, encouraged, and spoke to others about Jesus. She always was doing ministry and taking care of the Lord's business. There is much to learn and model from this woman.

The third and final commendation, "In the Lord" Persis worked hard, pushing herself to the limit of her power, yet, she trusted God for renewed strength from the Holy Ghost. Zechariah 4:6 reads, "Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the Lord of hosts.

The work God has for us to do is accomplished by his power and not our own. We can learn to stay focused on kingdom work that glorifies God. Working in the church should always be in the will of the Lord and not about our personal goals or for the praise of men.

Women of God there is much work for us to do. Remember Persis, keep her as a model of church work before us that we also may be commended by God.


