Twenty five years ago, I stood before family, friends, pastor, and husband to declare “I do” through sickness and in health.

Unbeknownst to me the sickness would come sooner than later. While the world was living in their own sickness and COVID, I was in the doctor’s office having my hand squeezed by my

husband hearing the words Cancer, Stage V. It was a surreal moment that I felt my husband fear! But it was also at that moment, the song “Real, Jesus is real to me oh yes, He gives me the victory. So many people doubt Him but I can’t live without Him that is why I love Him so cause He’s so real to me”. Why that song and at the moment? Made no sense to me.

The following week, we learned the type of cancer and saw where the tumors were throughout his entire body, more than 100 tumors! His fear became greater. But for some reason his fear did not transfer to me rather my faith grew at an enormous rate. Everything I’d been taught, every scripture, every song, every testimony became REAL and the only action I knew to do was BELIEVE. I believed God would heal miraculously and HE did it under the predicted time of 8 months and his cancer was in remission in 2 months. The doctor was impressed.

I, on the other hand was not because as the hymn says “I serve a risen Savior, He’s in the world today. I know that He is living whatever men may say. I see His hand of mercy, I hear His voice of cheer and just the time I NEED Him, He’s always near”

Healthy Living Epilepsy

What is epilepsy?

Epilepsy is a brain disorder that causes repeated seizures. There are different types of epilepsy and different types of seizures. Patients can control their epilepsy by taking medicine, having surgery, using medical devices, and even following a special diet (according to the CDC).

Approximately 578,000 African Americans have epilepsy and over 25,000 African Americans are diagnosed each year. African Americans are more likely to be diagnosed with epilepsy than Caucasians. Making epilepsy diagnosis in African Americans is a critical problem due to several contributing factors, such as stroke, fear, stigma, misperceptions, and discrimination.

Five things that everyone needs to know about epilepsy are:

1. It is very common. In the US, about 3.4 million people are living with epilepsy. That’s equal to the combined population of New Mexico, Vermont, and West Virginia.
2. All seizures are not the same!!! Sure, some people may fall to the ground and shake violently. However, others may experience confusion, or stare into space, or just wander around and may not be able to answer questions or talk. The main point is that one size shoe does not fit all when it come to seizures.
3. Even you can give first aid to someone having a seizure. Keep the person safe until the seizure stops and call 911. There are seizure first aid courses offered by CDC and the Epilepsy Foundation.
4. People with epilepsy can lead full, productive lives. Depending on the type of epilepsy that a person has, some people may face more challenges, but help is available.
5. Some causes of epilepsy are preventable. Protecting yourself from traumatic brain injury (helmets, airbags, preventing falls, etc. Lower your chances for stroke and heart disease (eating healthy, exercising, good habits). Stay up on your vaccinations for communicable diseases. Prepare food safely and staying healthy during pregnancy.

Myths to avoid concerning epilepsy and seizure:

Do NOT put a spoon or any other object in the persons mouth during a seizure. Epilepsy is NOT contagious. Seizures CAN be controlled. Epilepsy is NOT due to a spiritual cause.


Cover Girls Unsung Heroes




