Biblical joy is a deep, abiding sense of peace and gladness rooted in God. Here are a few scriptures on "Joy".

Peace and Joy: Romans 15:13; 14:17 Joy in God's Presence: Psalm 16:11; Joy and Rejoicing: Philippians 4:4; God's Joy: 3 John 1:4; Psalm 149:4

Becoming a Trauma-Informed Church

Four "Rs" of What it Means to be Trauma Informed

- 1. **REALIZE:** the frequency and pervasiveness of trauma
- Educating congregation members and ministry leaders about the prevalence of childhood adversity and trauma
- ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences)
- ACEs are traumatic events that happen between ages 1 and 17.
- Creating a culture of awareness

"You are a child of God. You are wonderfully made, dearly loved, and precious in His sight." Psalm 139.

- 2. **RECOGNIZE:** the signs and symptoms associated with trauma
- Individuals who have experienced trauma often behave in unpredictable, unreliable, and unstable ways, as a result of the biological and chemical changes in their bodies and brains.
- We may feel disgusted or frustrated; but if we consider asking what happened to you, instead of what is wrong with you, we can possibly uncover the real problems or burdens.
- 3. **RESPOND:** by integrating knowledge into policy, practices, and procedures
- Providing information, establishing, and implementing a safe church policy in places of worship and ministry.
- A policy in place communicates to trauma victims that the church is aware of the prevalence and source of trauma and is willing to respond.
- 4. **RESIST:** Re-Traumatization: Do not harm them or their families again.
- By understanding the internal experiences of a traumatized mind, we can ensure that we do not do more harm.
- We walk alongside them in their suffering.
- Who would a victim come forward to and what would their experience be like if they shared their story?
- Would they feel safe disclosing?

Many people are carrying burdens they no longer want to carry and frankly, do not deserve to carry. Galatians 6:2 (Amp) "Bear (endure, carry) one another's burdens and troublesome moral faults, and in this way fulfill and observe perfectly the law of Christ."

Are we that church?

SAMSHA (Substance Abuse & Mental Health Services Administration) has identified four "Rs" of what it means to be trauma informed.

Every month, the Cover Girls Newsletter honors a member who works in ministry not to be seen but because they love the work they do. They are our Unsung Heroes. This month, we celebrate Brother Mickey Williams.


Brother Mickey is that member who is available for anything at anytime. He is always a willing helper to do whatever you need him to do. Brother Mickey has been attending GTI since 2013 but didn't join until 2015. Prior to joining GTI, he was a member of Acts Full Gospel COGIC. He was going through a divorce and was looking for a change. Bishop Bob actually recommended GTI to him.

Brother Mickey stated he was a part of the Delancy Street Treatment Center for drugs and alcohol. He has been clean and sober for over 23 years. In 2008, he suffered a massive stroke. At that time, he had been sober for several years and the doctors told his family he wouldn't live 6 months but God.

When Brother Mickey first joined GTI, he would sit in the back of the church but Sister Tranito of the Hospitality Department asked him to assist in that ministry. Even though the stoke left him partially paralyzed and not able to use one of his arms, it never stopped him from working. From working with Sister Tranito, he started working with Deacon Payne in the Evangelism Ministry. He also worked with the Deacon and Sister Robinson in Pastoral Care Ministry, the New Members with Elder and Missionary Logan for 3 years and the Singles Ministry (SWAT). Currently, he is on the board of the Men's Ministry. He has been on the board since Deacon Logan was in charge of the Men's Ministry. He stated, "I've worked with Elder McClure, Elder Capers, Elder Williams, and now, Elder Washington.

Most recently, Brother Mickey has been recuperating at home from being in the hospital for 8 days with congestive heart failure and a fibrillation. He wasn't feeling well and went to emergency, They discovered he had a lot of fluid around his heart. So much fluid around his heart, when he went to the hospital, he weigh 218 and when he left, his weight was 192. Brother Mickey attends the Center for Elderly Independence on Tuesdays and Thursdays every week. They provide transportation for him to the center. He receives physical therapy, occupational therapy, and blood work. He has a social worker assigned to him.

Even though he has not been able to attend church lately, he stated, "I watch every Sunday on line and I still send my tithes through Deacon Porter and/or Elder Russell. Brother Mickey is eager to return to in-person church because he misses the fellowship with the saints. He lives near the church and used to walk to church but now the brothers provide transportation for him. Sometimes, they pick him up with the golf cart.

This young girl declared hope and faith in God even in the mist of her despondency. Naaman got permission from the king to go to Israel to see the prophet.


