It was a usual call but I was sensing something was not quite right. She said that very one thing no child wants to hear about their parent. "Your father received a report from the doctor, he has stage 4 cancer".

My heart just dropped in total dismay. All I could think of at that very moment was I need to get to my father. Without any hesitation, I headed to go see about him. When I arrived at my father's house, all I could do was embrace and comfort him.

I will honestly say, the situation looked very bleak. I knew I had to make a decision whether to choose to doubt or choose to believe. Well, I chose to have faith and declared that my father was HEALED OF CANCER!! It is now 20 years later since my father has been healed of cancer!!

Now my question to you is whose report will you believe? I choose to believe God!!!

Chronic Kidney Disease

Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) is a disorder where the kidneys become damaged over time and may not clean the blood in the body properly. When CKD occurs, toxic waste and extra fluid accumulate in the body and contribute to high blood pressure, heart disease, stroke, and early death.

The kidneys filter the blood in your body removing waste products and toxins every 30 minutes. Consequences of CKD includes anemia, increased infections, low calcium, high potassium, and phosphorus levels in the blood. CKD may get worse over time, however, treatment may slow progression. Untreated CKD will lead to kidney failure and require dialysis or a kidney transplant for survival. At this stage, kidney failure is referred to as end-stage renal disease (ESRD).

"You are a child of God. You are wonderfully made, dearly loved, and precious in His sight." Psalm 139.

In 2022, there were more than 90,000 individuals waiting for a kidney transplant. Only 26,309 received a transplant. That means that only 1 in 4 individuals were able to get a kidney for transplant for that year. CKD affects 1 in 7 adults in the US. It is more common in individuals over 65, slightly more common in women, slightly more common in non-Hispanic Black adults followed by Hispanic adults. Black Americans are 4.2 times more likely to develop CKD. In the US, diabetes and high blood pressure are leading causes of kidney failure.

Many people with CKD may not notice any symptoms and their disease is not discovered until they go for a routine checkup. Therefore, CKD should be tested for regularly and especially in individuals with diabetes and high blood pressure. One important blood test is the serum creatinine. If the kidneys are not working properly, this substances increases in the blood. Another test is the glomerular filtration rate (GFR) which measures how well the kidneys remove waste and toxins from the blood.

What can you do to help lower your risk for CKD or keep it from getting worse? Eat healthy, be active, and keep your blood pressure and cholesterol levels in your target range. Be sure to go for regular checkups with your primary care physician. Be very diligent in taking prescribed medicines for high blood pressure and diabetes (when indicated) and any other prescribed medicines.

Words of Wisdom

Stay With God!

Quitting is easy! Sticking with a commitment and finishing well is not always so easy. In our society, it seems that quitting has become a favorite pastime. According to the Business Insider, 2022 cemented a new American pastime: quitting your job. In one month, a record 4.5 million workers said "I quit." But it seems that the trend of quitting is not just restricted to the job force. Many Christians have adapted that same mindset regarding their relationship with the church and their walk with God. The Washington Post examined why so many Christians are quitting the church. In part, the report found numerous main-stream evangelicals dropped out because they moved (22%), services were inconvenient (16%), they no longer believed (14%), and/or they had other priorities (15%). The report goes on and on but the bottom line is that, for various reasons, scores of people who at one time said that they knew and followed God have decided to abandon their relationship with Him. This is a very sad and disturbing trend; one that can have eternal consequences for those who don't stay with God.

What does it mean to stay with God? It means to cling to Him, to follow Him closely, and to be totally and completely committed to Him and His word. Some people accept the Lord Jesus, but because they don't make Him Lord over everything and seek to become strong in the Word and in spiritual disciplines, they find themselves falling back into habits of their past life, and eventually declining back into the world.

John 15:4 says, "Abide in me and I in you...for without me you can do nothing." Yes, this race is not always smooth and the adversary will always try to make us turn away from God. But the same God that saved us has promised us strength for this journey. Isaiah 41:10 says, "Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness." Isaiah 40:31 promises that "but they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint."
