The doctors told us he wouldn't be able to see, talk, or walk again. They predicted, he would live the rest of his life in a vegetative state. They said, they had done all they could do and that we should just pray for a miracle.

Prostate Cancer and Shingles Awareness Month

Prostate Cancer: Encourage the Men in Your Life

Prostate cancer is one of the most common cancers in men, especially those over 50. Black men are more likely to be diagnosed and are twice as likely to die from the disease compared to other racial groups.

What can you do?

- Start the conversation. Many men avoid doctor visits so your encouragement matters.
- Recommend regular screenings for those 50+, or earlier if there's a family history. Starting with a simple blood test can literally be a lifesaver.
- Support healthy habits. A balanced diet and exercise help lower risk.

Shingles: A Painful Condition That Can Be Prevented

Shingles is a painful rash caused by the reactivation of the chickenpox virus. Anyone who has had chickenpox can develop shingles, especially older adults.

Key Facts for You and Your Loved Ones:

- Shingles can happen at any age, but risk increases after age 50.
- It can cause lasting nerve pain (postherpetic neuralgia).
- A shingles vaccine is available and recommended for adults 50+.

Encourage older family members (and yourself!) to speak with a doctor about shingles prevention. It's an easy way to stay healthy and avoid unnecessary pain.

Your Role as a Health Advocate

As women, we often guide our families toward care. This month, let's use our voices to:

- Encourage regular checkups for husbands, brothers, fathers, and friends.
- Learn about vaccines and early screenings.
- Support those who may already be navigating illness.

This September, let's lift our families in both prayer and action, being watchful stewards over their health.

Cover Girls Unsung Heroes

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Every month, the Cover Girls Newsletter honors a member who works in ministry not to be seen but because they love the work they do. They are our Unsung Heroes. This month, we celebrate District Missionary Sabrina Jones.

District Missionary Sabrina and her husband, Deacon Tony Jones have been members of GTI since February 2013. They started attending in August 2012. They were members of her uncle's church but when that church closed, her uncle and aunt who were members previously before starting their ministry came back to Glad Tidings as well. DM Sabrina was familiar with GTI because they were apart of the NorCal fellowship, so it made the transition easy.

When they first joined, Deacon Ricky Smith was the first person to reach out to them and it was a wonderful connection. Then she connected with Sister Robinson who reached out to her and encouraged her to get involved with the Deaconess Ministry. She was serving in that capacity at her uncle's church, so Bishop allowed her to continue serving as a deaconess. She received her Deaconess Missionary License in 2013. Sister Sabrina started working in NorCal Jurisdiction, assisting Lady Nobles with Mother Dancey, who was the Jurisdictional Supervisor at the time as the Jurisdictional Secretary. When Mother Hunt became the Jurisdictional Supervisor, she asked Sister Sabrina to continue in that role and she agreed. She loves working with Mother Hunt and assisting her with NorCal.

When Bishop called and asked her to be District Missionary in 2023, she respectfully declined, and said, "I'm not qualified to do it but thank you for thinking of me." This was on a Sunday and on that following Thursday, Mother Hunt called her and said, "I understand Bishop Macklin would like for you to be the District Missionary. I need you to take that job. You are qualified, plus I'm going to train you. You are going to be fine. You call Bishop and tell him yes." Sister Sabrina told her she was praying about it but stated "In my heart, I was not committed to doing it." On that Saturday morning, during the workers meeting, Bishop called the hotel and was talking with Deacon Tony, she stated, "As I was eavesdropping on the conversation, I heard Deacon Tony say, well Bishop, I can't make her do it if she doesn't want to." Then, I heard the Holy Spirit say, "Didn't you organize the entire 311 call center for the City of Oakland for over 450 thousand residents? Didn't you become the manager of the entire program? The Holy Ghost was working on me and before the call ended with Bishop and Deacon Tony, I said yes. I also didn't want to do it if Lady Macklin didn't endorse it or bless it and that is when Bishop told me, it was Lady Macklin who recommended me. So it was sealed."

DM Sabrina loves her church. She said, "I love the stable, solid, structure of this ministry. It is something you can count on. I needed that. She also loves the different ministries and the people who are Glad Tidings."

John 8:1-11 Forgiven and Transformed

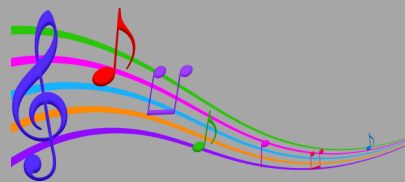

When Bishop Macklin approached her about stepping into the role of Director of Health & Wellness Ministry, he

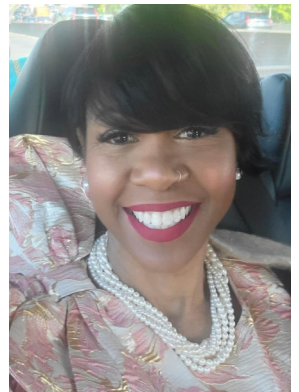
