Inspirational Testimony

What a mighty God we serve. God is a miracle worker. I thank Him for being a healer!

I was in Los Angeles babysitting of my grandson while his parents were in New York, when my husband called saying he walked up the stairs, was out of breath and having difficulty catching his breath. I asked him if he had taken his blood pressure medicine that day and he said he did. I told him to take his pressure using the equipment we have at home.

He said, he was just going to lie down, and the feeling was going to past. I told him to take his pressure before he did anything. When he took his pressure, it was 215/157. I said, "Ben you need to call 911 now". He gave me every excuse why he didn't want to call. I told him

"You can make the call, or I would send the paramedics to the house myself".

When the paramedics arrived, and they took his blood pressure again and immediately rushed him to emergency. I felt helpless because I wasn't there, and my husband was being rushed to emergency.

Arrangements were made for my grandson, and I flew home the next day. I knew there was nothing I could that first day, but I serve a God that can do anything but fail. I begin to pray and asked God to be there with him and give him peace in his spirit.

They ran several tests and the results revealed he has an enlarged heart, and his heart was only pumping at 25%. He had to be on 100% oxygen to breathe and was immediately placed in ICU for 5 days. The doctor informed us, if he would have

laid down and not call the paramedics, he would have died.

The doctor ran one more test, a CT Angiogram, to determine if he had any blockages. I called on my GTI family and they began to bombard heaven with prayers. The procedure was on Thursday morning, they did not find any blockages and my husband was discharged that afternoon. Thank you, Jesus! They are able to treat his condition with medication and routine follow ups.

Who wouldn't serve a God like this. He is a mighty God. I want to thank my GTI family for all your prayers and calls. I love my GTI family!

Healthy Living New Year's Resolution

People are always prompted to get a new start at the beginning of the new year. According to Brad Zomick of Softskills, the top 10 most common resolutions are:

1. Exercise more; 2. Lose weight; 3. Get organized; 4. Learn a new skill or hobby; 5. Live life to the fullest; 6. Save more money/spend less money; 7. Quit smoking; 8. Spend more time with family and friends; 9. Travel more; 10. Read more.

If we are honest with ourselves, many of us rarely reach our goals and our resolutions are forgotten or put off for other things. According to a study published in the Journal of Clinical Psychology, only 46% of people who made New Year's resolutions were successful. That means over half of the people who set a goal for the new year will fail! Mr. Zomick offers a plan to assist you in following through with your intentions. His ten-step plan includes the following:

Mentally prepare for change; Set a goal that motivates you; Limit resolutions to a manageable amount; Be specific; Break up big goals into smaller goals; Write down your goals; Share your resolutions with others; Automate where possible; Review your resolution regularly; If you fall off track, get back on quick.

I am partial to a plan outlined by Bishop Macklin years ago for decision-making. It is much shorter and has helped me "keep it moving" many times, Grasp the Vision, Make a decision, and Move Forward

You can employ Zomicks tactics as well. The point is that you can make changes that have a positive impact on your life. The beginning of a New Year is a good starting place. "Nothing Changes Until Something Changes" Bishop J. W. Macklin.



This month in Spotlight Corner, the Cover Girls Newsletter celebrates “GTI Annual Consecration 2023”.

For the past 44 years, the Glad Tidings International Church of God in Christ has come together in prayer and consecration the first week of January of the new year. The consecration would start at 6 am that Friday morning when we turn our plates down from that time until after church Sunday morning. We would also move into the church on Friday night and stay until Saturday evening only to go home to prepare for Sunday morning service. It was a time the GTI family looked forward to every year in January. It was our way of starting the New Year off in the right direction.

Then COVID hit in 2020 and it changed everything. For the first time, the consecration was on line only in January 2021. That same year, the church doors were able to open back to in person service. As 2021 came to a close, another variant of COVID hit and Consecration 2022 was on line again as well.

So today, it's January 1, 2023 and in just 6 short days, we will have our 45th Annual Consecration. This will be the first time in 2 years, we will be able to be in person. Finally, after 2 years we will be together worshipping and praise God. At 6 am, Friday morning no more eating until after church Sunday. At 9 am, prayer begins on line.

Annual Consecration

Friday evening at 7 pm, we will meet in person in the sanctuary for worship. We will come together in corporate praise and worship. It's been two long years and it's not just about being able to come together but it's all about unity, family, and oneness. On Saturday at 12 noon, we will come again for worship and praise. Then on Sunday, service will begin at 8 am with prayer, which will lead us into Sunday morning service.

I can promise you, if you commit to this consecration, it will be the best decision you would make in your life. This will be a life changing event. You will experience the move of God in a way that will be life altering. Don't say to yourself you can't do this consecration because you can. I know for some of you, this may be the first time you have ever went on a consecration and you already saying to yourself, “I have never missed a meal”. But this is not just about missing a meal but it's about a closer walk, a spiritual journey, a deeper relationship with God.

Start planning today for this weekend. Start preparing your body now. Don't try to eat everything you can think of because you think you are never going to eat again. Start wheening yourself off sweets, heavy starches, and red meat.
